

# Notes from the meeting held on Tuesday 15th March 2011

Allotments The Beech Lane allotments are now up and running. 19 plots have already been allocated, but there are still 12 left and they need to be cultivated as soon as possible. So, if you fancy 'growing your own', get in touch with the Parish Clerk, hire a plot and get digging. It's good exercise and can be very rewarding. And if you are a novice, don't worry! There are experienced gardeners down there who will be pleased to give you advice. Currently, the allotments are being allocated to Kislingbury Parishioners, but if they are not all taken up, we may have to take the decision to advertise outside the village.

It has taken three long years to get the allotment project to this stage. Three years of frustration, determination, time and effort. And the person who has been in the driving seat from the very beginning is **Gordon Seal**. He has often said he should have stuck to his day job, it was less stressful, but we are very glad that he didn't! We now have a great village amenity which will be there, in perpetuity, for all our future gardeners to enjoy. So on behalf of us all, "**Thank you, Gordon. A job well done!**"

Road Across The Green We are still trying to come up with a workable solution to prevent further damage to The Green. At a site meeting last month, the NCC Highways Representative suggested a "One Way System" might be the answer. This could mean that vehicles going from Church Lane on to the Bugbrooke Road would use the diagonal road and traffic entering Church Lane from the Bugbrooke Road would use the straight bit. MGWSP will be carrying out a feasibility study in the new financial year and will pass on their findings to the Parish Council. If the results are positive, we will have to make a very emotive decision. In the meantime, we would like to know what you think about the idea. Let us have your views, in writing, please. Thank you in anticipation!

<u>Local Elections</u> On Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May, you will have the opportunity to vote for the nine members of Kislingbury Parish Council that you would like to have serving your Parish for the next 4 years. If you are on the electoral roll, and if you are 18 years or over, it is your democratic right to vote. We urge you to use it. You won't get this opportunity again for another four years! If you are unable to get to the polling station, then it is not too late to apply for a postal vote. Contact Ann Addison, or me, for an application form.

If you would like to be on the list of candidates for the Parish Council, you still have time to put in your nomination papers. You can get these from SNC Offices in Towcester, or contact the Parish Clerk. If you still can't make up your mind and would like some more information, come along

and see me, or any of the council members, and we will do all we can to help you.

<u>Bus Services</u> Our County Councillor, Joan Kirkbride, reported that NCC is reviewing the County Bus Services and the subsidies it makes to keep the bus services in operation. Vast sums of money are spent on subsidising the buses and Joan referred to one bus which was costing NCC over £100 per person, per journey! The County Council would like to know if you have any comments you would like to make about the bus services in this area and suggestions for economical uses of the buses when the subsidies are cut. You can get in touch directly with Cllr. Joan Kirkbride, or pass your comments to NCC through the Parish Clerk.

Annual Parish Meeting This meeting is held on the same day as, and immediately before, the April Parish Council Meeting. It is not a Parish Council meeting, but it is chaired by the Parish Council Chairman and it is open to all Parishioners. It is an opportunity for you to come along and air your views without the constraints of a regular Parish Council meeting. No spot decisions will be made, but minutes will be taken and anything which needs further action or investigation will be followed up by the Parish Council. The meeting will be held on Tuesday 19th April 2011 at Kislingbury Village Hall at 7.15pm. We will be very pleased to see you and look forward to a big turn out. So please, do not disappoint us!

#### Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter - Kislingbury News April 2011

Village news - The number of crimes in our Village has increased recently and we have had in the early part of March a number of vandalism incidents, culminating with the disturbance at the Playing Fields on Friday March 11th to which the Police were called, but which also resulted in other vandalism incidents in the Village. The next night eggs were thrown at the front of the Olde Red Lion Pub, which is stupid behaviour, but takes a lot of effort to clean up. I have also heard of an attempted break-in in Millers Close. This does not appear on the February Crime Report so I can only assume that it was not reported to the Police. There was an attempted break-in to a house in Mill Lane in early March, not reported to the Police, and on the same night I understand that there was an attempt to break-in to a house in Mill Road. A suspicious vehicle was seen in The Orchard and a Street Representative there challenged the occupants who then left. This was reported to the Police.

#### From the Monthly Police Crime Report:

**Kislingbury** – Wrights Lane. Burglary in a Dwelling between the hours of 1930 and 1955 on 28th Feb 2011. Person[s] gain entry to premises via rear insecure window. Car keys removed and vehicle stolen from driveway. Vehicle subsequently recovered. Kislingbury – Nene Way, Criminal Damage caused to vehicle between the hours of 1300 on 20th Feb and 1600 on 21st Feb 2011. Person[s] scratch full length of parked vehicle. Kislingbury – Nene Way, Criminal Damage caused to vehicle between the hours of 1500 on 20th Feb and 1500 on 21st Feb 2011. Person[s] scratch front and rear doors of vehicle. Kislingbury – Bugbrooke Road. Burglary in a Building [ Not Dwelling] between the hours of 2030 and 2055 on 9th Feb 2011. Person[s] enter location and force open door to premises.

It is very important to tell the Police that an incident is happening, or as soon after as you can. If we do not tell them, and the thieves see no Police response, they will conclude that Kislingbury is easy pickings and come back again. The Police do not mind getting calls. More importantly they need the calls to help them fight Crime. Please use 999 for Emergencies or the number 01604 432 436 to report what you see immediately, or call me on 07855 388 751, if you want to report a crime or something or somebody suspicious.

# A Tale from Kislingbury Archives

# **Extracts from the Minutes of Kislingbury Parish Council**

#### **July 17th 1896**

"A resolution was passed in favour of a Railway Station at Bugbrooke, as being an advantage to the Parish."

# December 9th 1897

"Proposed that the Clerk write to the District Council and inform them that some of the inhabitants living near the village well use the water for cattle, especially pigs, some of whom keep 20 to 30, thereby causing the well to become empty so that the inhabitants are without water for domestic purposes."

#### February 10th 1898

"The Footpaths Committee reported that since the Green had been put in proper order, that Mr. Richard Jeffs did wilfully damage the Green to the extent of 1 shilling by carting thereon after being cautioned not to do so. After discussion Mr. Luckett proposed that he be prosecuted and that the Clerk take out a summons against him "

# Kislingbury CE Primary School

A vacancy has arisen on the Governing Body of the school for a Foundation Governor. Foundation Governors are a Christian presence on the governing body of a Church of England School. They have the same duties and responsibilities as other school governors but, in addition, they are charged with ensuring that the school's ethos, distinctiveness and effectiveness as a Church School is maintained and developed. Foundation Governors represent the interests of the Church locally in the school and school in the local Church; as such they are a vital community link.

# DOG FOULING

Despite regular requests via this notice, and approaches to dog owners at the Playing Field, we continue to <u>find dog fouling on the Playing areas</u>.

In the past month a number of people have been requested to place their dogs on leads despite all the notices around the Playing Field THIS IS UNPLEASANT AND A HEALTH HAZARD

PLEASE HELP US TO KEEP OUR PLAYING FIELD CLEAR OF DOG'S MESS FOR THE BENEFIT OF PLAYERS, ADULTS and in particular CHILDREN

WHEN IN THE PLAYING FIELD PLEASE KEEP YOUR DOGS ON A LEAD. THANK YOU.

#### THE DANGERS OF DOG DIRT

A local farmer is soon to put his herd of bullocks out on a meadow on the other side of The Mill in Kislingbury. This meadow has a public footpath running across it to Harpole and it is used frequently by dog walkers from Kislingbury. Prior to letting his bullocks loose, the farmer did a walkabout on his field and was horrified at the amount of dogs' dirt left there. His worry is, that this might infect his cattle and ultimately be passed on to humans in the food chain. According to information on the internet, humans cannot be infected in this way. However, Parish Council has been asked if notices could be put up requesting dog walkers to take their dog waste home with them.

There is a vast amount of information on the internet relating to diseases which can be passed on from dogs' and cats' faeces to humans, cattle and sheep. Here are a couple of relevant ones!

<u>Toxocariasis</u> is spread in the faeces of dogs. It is an infection caused by parasites that are known as Toxocara Canis, more commonly known as roundworm. These can cause blindness, amongst other things, if ingested by humans. Children are more at risk of infection because they are less aware of the importance of hygiene and cleanliness. They are more likely to put their fingers in their mouths! To prevent the spread of infection, dog owners should always dispose of dog faeces in a responsible way.

<u>Neosporosis</u> The parasite, Neospora, is found in dogs' faeces and, if they foul grazing land and pregnant cattle ingest the parasite, it will cause them to abort or give birth to calves infected for life. Apparently, just one incident of a cow eating some of these parasitic eggs can have a huge impact on a whole herd - and a farmers future livelihood.

Farming organisations and landowners are trying to raise awareness of the Neospora Parasite and are urging all dog owners to clean up after their pets when they are walking in the countryside.

According to sources on the internet, there is no danger to humans from eating meat from an infected cow or drinking it's milk, so we needn't worry on that score.

The information above is very much condensed and should be read about in more detail on the many websites on the internet.


