Notes from the meeting held on Tuesday 18th October 2011

Full Council We were pleased to welcome Kay Longland to the Council. Kay has been co-opted to fill the final vacancy, which brings Kislingbury Parish Council up to its full strength of nine Councillors.

KPFA Phil Beeston, the Chairman of Kislingbury Playing Field Association, attended the meeting and gave Councillors a brief resume of the KPFA's plans for the future. One of the main aims is to make the Playing Field a place which can be enjoyed, not just by the Sports Clubs, but by all the family. A stumbling block for any organisation, which is trying to expand and improve, is funding, so the KPFA will be looking to improve the facilities and to try to generate a regular income. Please watch out for forthcoming progress reports and KPFA fundraising events and give your full support, which will be very much appreciated. The Chairman thanked Phil for his informative talk and wished the KPFA every success in the future.

Development The Homes and Communities Agency has submitted an outline planning application to the West Northamptonshire Development Corporation for up to 1,000 residential units, primary school and local centre, up to 2,000 sq metres, on Upton Park Land, off Weedon Road, Northampton (which is to the west of the current Upton Scheme). All matters are reserved except for access. The above application can be viewed on-line at **www.wndc.org.uk** and follow the link '**Search Planning Applications**'. Alternatively, it is available for inspection at WNDK Offices, Franklins Gardens, St James End.

School Crossing Patrol The Head Teacher of Kislingbury Primary School, Mrs. Northing, has informed us that, with the help of the £1,000 grant from the Parish Council, the school has been able to raise sufficient funds to pay for the 'Lollipop Lady' (is that Politically Correct?) to operate until the end of the current school year in July 2012. This was very good news, for this year, but unfortunately, the school now has to start all over again for the next one.

Having Fun Before the next Parish Council Meeting, 31st October and 5th November celebrations will have come and gone. Please follow the safety rules for both these occasions and while you are

enjoying yourselves, please make sure that you allow other people to do the same. Have a good time!

Its Not Just God!

It never ceases to amaze me even after twenty five years of wearing a dog-collar the comments it generates from people of all ages.

Take, for example, a couple of years ago at the Kislingbury Plant Fayre I was approached by a young person from the primary school who proudly declared I didn't look like a Vicar, the response I received when I asked what did a Vicar look like still brings a smile to my face. Taking a couple of steps back and while looking me up and down with a slight look of disdain on the face proclaimed loud and clear to me, and the others I was sitting with "better dressed than you!"

The more adventurous questions revolve around what I do and what I say, or in some cases what I do not say! At a recent gathering and buffet lunch one person was a little indignant about the articles I wrote for the various publications around the villages declaring "I wish you wouldn't preach when you write!" I followed the comment with a question about what should I write about (with tongue in cheek), "the price of cheese on the bacon market?" What followed was good banter with me eventually drawing the conversation to an end by pointing to my dog-collar and saying "there's a clue here around my neck, I do God!"

If conversations just stayed at God there would be no real problem as those with a faith and those without a faith can talk about and around the possibilities of his/her existence. However, the rub comes when the conversation turns from just talking about God to talking about Jesus and who he was or was not. Jesus was either who he claimed to be or at the very least, a misguided or deluded man.

C.S. Lewis of *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* wrote:

I am trying here to prevent anyone saying the really foolish thing that people often say about Him: "I'm ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don't accept his claim to be God." That is the one thing we must not say. A man who was merely a man and said the sort of things Jesus said would not be a great moral teacher. He would either be a lunatic – on the level with the man who says he is a poached egg – or else he would be the Devil of Hell. You must make your choice. Either this man was, and is, the Son of God, or else a madman or something worse. You can shut him up for a fool, you can spit at him and kill him as a demon or you can fall at his feet and call him Lord and God, but let us not come with any patronising nonsense about his being a great human teacher. He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to.

As we make our way through this last quarter of 2011 take a few moments to think about what C.S. Lewis is claiming.

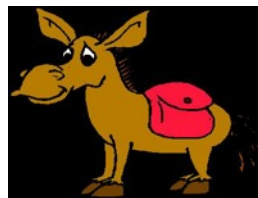

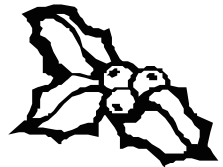

Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter Kislingbury News November 2011

The Police have informed me that there is a new Phone Number we can use for Non Emergency calls. The new 101 national police non-emergency number is being launched in Northamptonshire in October. From Monday 17 October, **101** will be the new number to contact Northamptonshire Police. The **101** non-emergency number will provide you with a single, easy to remember number for you to call to report crime and other concerns that do not require an emergency police response. You will be able to call **101** to report a crime that has already happened and any other incidents or concerns that do not require an emergency response. You can also call it to speak to your local Safer Community Team, to make a general enquiry or make the Police aware of any policing issues in your local area. **999** should still be used in an emergency, such as when a crime is happening, someone suspected of a crime is nearby, someone is injured, being threatened or a life is at risk, or there is a traffic incident involving personal injury or danger. If you have any hearing difficulties or a speech impairment send text messages to **18001 101**. Calls to **101** from landlines and mobiles cost 15 pence per call, no matter what time of day you call or how long your call lasts. **101** is already in use in a number of areas across England and Wales and is being rolled out to the remaining police force areas on a phased basis over the next few months. The Police local number – 03000 111 222 – will remain available while 101 becomes established and for those calling from outside England and Wales, as well as for callers outside Northamptonshire where 101 is not yet live. The dedicated 'Neighbourhood Watch Line' number 01604 432436 is still fully operational and will remain so once **101** has been launched.

Halloween and Bonfire Nights are close and we should all be extra vigilant about safety during this period as young people are often involved with these events. We need to take care to supervise Trick and Treating activities, respecting those who have put up signs that they do not wish to be involved. And the dangers of Fire and Fireworks are well known and need adults to supervise all situations. Let us keep our Village safe over this period.

There is a new "Watch" Scheme that has been launched. This is called Dog Watch. Following the hugely successful launch of Dog Watch in East Northamptonshire and Wellingborough, the Dog Watch team have extended the scheme across the whole county and are keen to invite all members of the Community to join as a member. Dog watch was originally developed in Stevenage as a way of extending the already successful Neighbourhood Watch network to the wider community. The scheme recognises it is often those who walk their dogs, runners or anyone who likes to get out and about, who are the first to spot something unusual or amiss, such as criminal damage or an incident of anti-social behaviour, providing valuable eyes and ears for the community. If you are one of these people and would like to start a Dog Watch Group in Kislingbury to support the Neighbourhood Watch activities please contact me and I will put you in touch with the right people.

There are still streets which do not have Street Representatives (Ashby Close, and Bugbrooke Road) and in my mind these streets are more vulnerable as there is no obvious NHW presence. Please contact me (telephone number and email address below) if you wish to volunteer to be the Street Representative for your street. This is not hard work, but it does help to make your neighbourhood more secure. 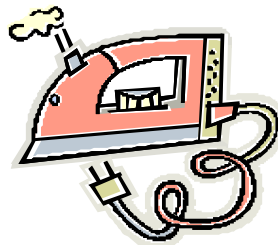
