Notes from the meeting held on Tuesday 19th January 2010

This is the Official Parish Council Website address.

It is, at last, up and running, albeit without too much on it, but we are hoping to add to it as time goes on and make it a really useful means of keeping you immediately up to date with what is going on in the Parish. But please, do not worry if you do not have a computer, or you are not interested in websites. We will continue to post minutes and other important information on the Parish Notice Boards and I will still continue with the monthly 'notes' from the Parish Council meetings, as long as I am required to do so. Let us know what you think! You can do this on line, or in the usual way by contacting a member of the Parish Council.

Guest Speaker Robert Fallon, who is the Development and Implementation Manager at South Northamptonshire Council, came along to speak to members of the Parish Council about proposed development in and around Kislingbury and SNC's policies regarding such developments. We were extremely pleased to welcome about 40 parishioners to the meeting, who asked some very pertinent questions and aired their concerns about the consequences of development in Kislingbury, i.e. Will the sewers and drains hold up? What about flooding? The traffic through the village is horrendous now, what will it be like with numerous additional vehicles? Will there be enough school places? If 26 houses are permitted, will it stop there, or is there likely to be further development? Is SNC giving enough thought and support to maintaining the Gap between Northampton and the local villages which are on its boundary? And so on! Robert stressed that the unpalatable fact is that 26 houses have to be built in Kislingbury and that the question is not 'if ' they should be built, but 'where?'

Land behind Millers Close For some years now, Parish Council has been trying to obtain this piece of land for the village. Since South Northamptonshire Homes became owners, Ann Addison, as our District Councillor, has been negotiating with them on our behalf and at last we have results. SNHomes will not give us the land, but have agreed we can rent it, at a 'peppercorn' rent, on a twenty year lease. At present, we will not have to pay any rent, but the 'peppercorn' clause gives SNHomes the scope to negotiate a rent in the future, should they have a mind to do so. However, we do have to pay

Solicitors fees for the preparation of the lease documentation, which could amount to a substantial sum of money. That aside, Parish Council agreed, with pleasure, to accept the offer and await further developments. We will keep you informed.

Camp Lane Gate Another long term struggle has now reached fruition! For some years now, we have been in talks with the Public Rights of Way to get a gate installed across Camp Lane. There are many reasons for this, not least being to prevent vehicular access to fly tippers, off road joy riders and travellers. Eventually, after much discussion and invaluable help and support from our Footpath Warden, Phil Beeston, the objective has been achieved. A gate has been installed across Camp Lane. The people who are entitled to vehicular access will be given a key so that they can go to and fro at will. We apologise for any inconvenience it may cause them, but hope they will feel it is worth the extra hassle. One key will be held by the Parish Council Chairman and one in the Parish Office at Gayton. A five foot gap has been left at the side of the gate to allow horses, wheel chairs, pushchairs, walkers, etc to continue using and enjoying Camp Lane at their leisure.

Dog Fouling We continue to get a number of complaints from residents about the amount of dog dirt left on our streets and footpaths. Many people are getting very angry with the irresponsible dog owners who fail to clear up the foul mess left in public spaces by their pets. Parish Council spent over £2,000.00 to purchase and install 'Doggie Bins' at strategic points in the village and currently spend £1,446.00 per annum to have them emptied every week. We would respectfully request all dog owners to clear up their dog's faeces and put it in the bins provided, or take it home and dispose of it in their own bins. Remember, it is an offence to allow your dog to foul public places and for you not to clear it up. The fine could be £1,000.00!

Litter Another problem is the increasing amount of litter which is left lying around on our roads and in our hedgerows. Please, do not throw your litter where ever you happen to be. Please take it home with you.

Sorry to end on a sour note.

The next meeting is on Tuesday 16th February at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.

Kislingbury Action Group (KAG) – Update

Explanation of ‘Keep the local Gap’ campaign

Many of you may have seen the signs in the village referring to the need to ‘keep the local gap’. This is a reference to SNC planning policy which formally recognises the existence of an ‘important local gap’ between Kislingbury and Northampton. Broadly the policy states that this is an important area, which should be kept free of development, to prevent the joining of Northampton and Kislingbury.

The ‘Gap’ area runs alongside the eastern edge of the village all the way to the Northampton County boundary. The current application for development in Beech Lane is in breach of this ‘Gap’ policy and we are therefore looking to draw as much attention as possible to this fact as it represents a potential reason for refusal of the application.

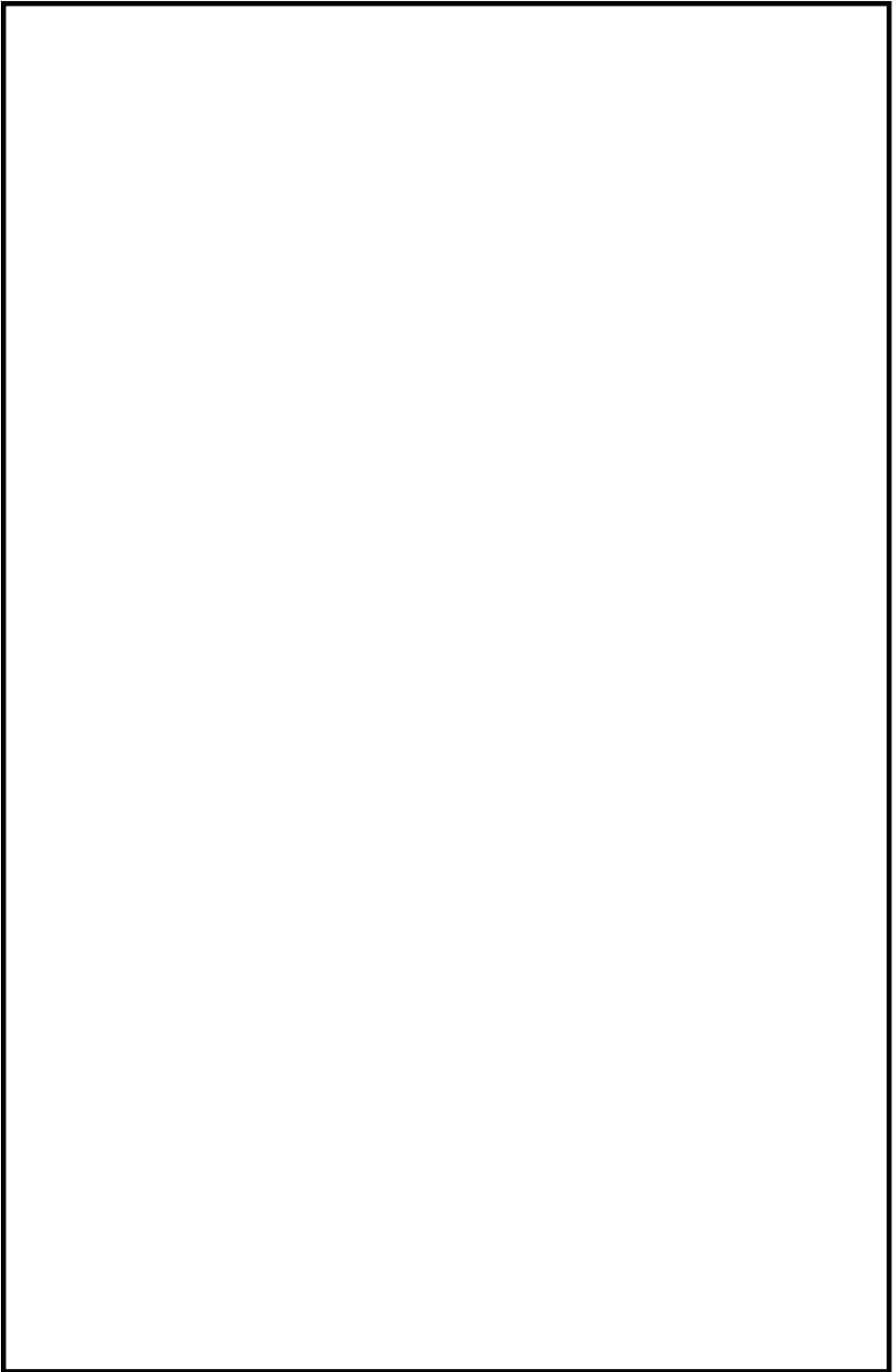

Monthly Recipe

Aberdeen Angus Beef Pot Roast - Serves 6

Pot roasting is a slow cooking method that results in beautifully tender meat. Here beef silverside is cooked in a flavoursome sauce of ready-made beef consommé and red wine. Prepared in just 10 minutes, this pot roast makes an extra-special Sunday lunch.

Ingredients

1 tbsp olive oil
800g-1kg Aberdeen Angus Beef Silverside
1 large red onion, cut into 2cm cubes
150ml red wine, such as Waitrose Chianti
2 medium courgettes, cut into 2cm slices
1 medium aubergine, cut into 2cm slices
1 leek, cut into 2cm slices
295g can Campbell's Special Choice Beef Consommé
1 large butternut squash

Method

Preheat the oven to 170°C, gas mark 3. Heat the oil in a deep, flameproof casserole over a high heat, add the beef and fry for 1-2 minutes on each side until browned all over. Remove from the pan and set aside.

Stir in the onion and red wine, using a wooden spoon to scrape up the sticky meat juices from the base of the dish, and cook until the wine has reduced by half.

Return the beef to the pan, along with the courgettes, aubergine, leek and consommé. Cover with a lid or seal tightly with foil. Cook in the oven for 1 hour, then stir well and cover again.

Cut the butternut squash in half, scoop out and discard the seeds. Wrap the squash halves individually in foil, place on a baking sheet and bake in the oven with the casserole for a further 1 hour, or until very tender.

Using a slotted spoon, remove the beef and vegetables from the casserole and keep warm. Place the casserole on the hob and bring the cooking juices to the boil over a high heat. Cook until reduced by half, then season to taste. Return the vegetables to the sauce, then spoon onto serving plates and top with slices of beef and large scoops of butternut squash.

Cook's tips

Browning the beef in Step 1 seals in all the juices and flavours of the meat.

Monthly Gardening Diary - February

- 1. Money saving tip:** Use old tights to secure young trees to the stake. They are strong and soft. Loosen or remove them before the following autumn to prevent strangulation of the bark.
- 2. Time saving tip:** Another tip for tights. Use them to cover the end of the gutter down pipe. This will prevent leaves and debris getting into the rainwater barrel. It will only need to be cleaned out once a year.
- 3.** Stand your seed potatoes in empty egg cartons with the rose end (rounded end) up. There are more 'eyes' at that end. Give them plenty of light as they start to grow.
- 4.** When soil conditions allow, dig leaf mould or compost into the vegetable garden. Apply lime at 4 ozs per square yard to area to be used for growing brassicas. Don't apply lime to potato ground.
- 5.** Large flowering clematis, which flower after June and the viticella and orientalis species are pruned now. Working up from the base find the lowest, healthy, fat, pair of buds on each stem and cut immediately above them.
- 6.** If the ground is too wet for planting, heel in bare root shrubs and trees to protect them from frost and drying out. Use damp sand or peat, making sure the roots are in contact and there are no air pockets.
- 7.** Keep an eye on seeds sown indoors. As soon as they germinate give them light but not direct sunlight. Turn those containers that are on window ledges every day to prevent the seedlings growing at an angle towards the light.
- 8.** Protect the base of trees and shrubs from rabbits and hares. They will be hungry and will soon strip the bark off a tree or branch. Once they have circled the trunk the tree will die. Remember that hares can reach to about 3 ft when standing on their hind legs.
- 9.** Refirm the soil round the roots of new plants. Frost and wind can lift the plants out of the ground. Firm with the foot and water.

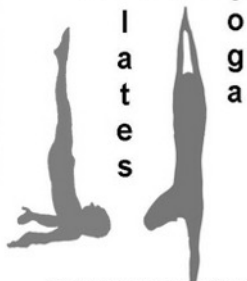
