Kislingbury Parish Council January 2024

These notes reflect the Parish Council's December 2023 and January 2024 meetings. The next two Parish Council Meetings will be on Tuesday 20th February and Tuesday 19th March.

The subsequent meeting (on Tuesday 16th April 2024) is also the date for the Annual Parish Meeting. This event has rather gone 'under the radar' in recent years but this year the Parish Council will be getting in touch with village organisations and groups to encourage them to use this meeting to share their plans with the wider village community. We will also be asking our village wardens to give an update. These will be in addition to my annual report.

Flooding and Drainage Issues

The flooding that occurred in early January brought to a head the issues that we as a village face. These issues were outlined by our Flood Warden, Chris Payne, at the Village Meeting of 16th January. I would like to express my thanks to Chris for the dedicated work he has put in over many months trying to resolve a range of issues. I would like to thank the villagers who came to the meeting and for their positive contributions.

The Flood Warden identified seven surface water/river water related issues, and an eighth was added during the Village Meeting. There is not sufficient space in these notes to detail each of these but it is clear that there is a common theme that links them. Chris has pointed out,

When people tell someone in authority, that may be the local council, the highways department, or the local Parish Council, they feel their responsibility has ended and that the 'authorities' will take over and fix said problem. Sadly, we know that this is not the case. The issue may be relatively minor and people may feel they have more important things to worry about. Or they try to chase it up but get beaten by the system, believing that the powers that be are intransigent and the issues cannot be altered.

A second common theme that emerged during the village meeting was the need to know the maintenance schedule for the village drainage system and ensure that this is carried out regularly. Kislingbury Parish Council is not responsible for the

river and the drains, but we can, and do, act to put pressure on those who are, including the West Northants contractor, Kier.

Following the village meeting, the Parish Council has agreed to produce a Flood Action Plan. A draft of this, which will draw on the Flood Warden's Report and villagers' comments, will be discussed at the February Parish Council Meeting. The Parish Council also committed to reviewing progress every three months. The first such review will take place at the Parish Council Meeting on 21st May 2024.

It is also important to point out that the flooding and drainage issues are not stand-alone issues. They have implications for planning. It is surely no coincidence that the flooding on Camp Lane has worsened since the Pembleton (Spitfire) development. The same issues also have implications for the way traffic moves through the village. When there is flood water some drivers insist on driving through even if it causes a 'wash' onto properties, damage to verges and a risk of being stranded.

Rothersthorpe Road (and other traffic issues!)

At the time of writing, the Parish Council is aware that four lorries have ended up in the ditch near the new chicane on the Rothersthorpe Road. The Parish Council thinks that the chicane and its signage is inadequate and dangerous and we are asking the West Northants Highways to remove it.

We welcome the extension of the 30 mph limits on the Rothersthorpe and Bugbrooke Roads. However, we are very disappointed that WNC Highways have turned down our request for a 20 mph limit on the High Street outside the school. The Parish Council will not let this one rest. In addition, we are also intending to buy 20 mph 'advisory' speed limit signs as we do think that these will have an effect on driver behaviour.

We are also investigating whether we can have a school warning sign on the High Street between the river bridge and the school. Finally, we hope that there will soon be three speed warning signs (VAS signs), complete with smiley faces on the roads coming into the village.

Camp Lane/Beech Lane and Hodges Lane Proposals

Both these two proposals are still officially 'pending' on the WNC Planning Portal. In the last few days there have been new documents relating to the Camp Lane/Beech Lane proposal. These focus on the noise from the grain drier, the closure of the butcher's shop and, perhaps more significantly, suggesting that local planning councils are no longer completely tied to set percentages about the increase to overall village size resulting from developments that are submitted as First Home Exception Schemes. The Parish Council will consider the implications of this, but if you do have any thoughts about this, I would be grateful if you could make contact.

The Parish Council considers that the major objections made last year by the Council and by over 100 parishioners are still no less relevant.

The submission of documents by the agents for the Beech Lane/Camp Lane proposal may mean that we are a step closer to a decision. When the application does go to a WNC Planning Committee, the Parish Council will let the village know and encourage people to attend.

Both the Camp Lane/Beech Lane and Hodges Lane developments raise issues about the impact of new development on our overstretched drains. The Parish Council will be making this plain to the planners.

In relation to the Hodges Lane development, it has been brought to the attention of the Parish Council that the developers have hired contractors to cut down the remaining trees on the site. The Parish Clerk has lodged an objection that we do not want any more trees removed.

Precept and Finance

At the January meeting it was confirmed that our Precept Request for 2024/2025 (the money received from West Northants Council) has been received. The request is for £66,000 which represents an increase of £5000 on last year's Precept. The biggest items of expenditure are the street lighting, grass mowing, the dog bins and village maintenance. The Parish Council also makes grants to village organisations including KPFA, the Football Club, Kislingbury News and the Church (for mowing).

All councillors and village wardens give their time freely and the Parish Clerk's part time salary only partially covers the work that she puts in. This means that most of the money is used for the direct benefit of Kislingbury.

The precept setting is a transparent process and villagers are always asked for their comments in advance. In the coming year we will be beginning our precept setting process in September. As part of this process the Council includes a budget heading for grants to local organisations for the 2025/2026 financial year. We plan to initiate discussion with these organisations in the next couple of months.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Money

As I mentioned in the last set of Parish Council Notes, we will be moving ahead on spending the CIL money which has come to Kislingbury as a result of house building (mainly the Pemberton development). Our list of priorities is still informed by health and safety concerns. I hope to have more details for the April/May Kislingbury News.

Reindeers on The Green

The Parish Council was pleased to be able to give financial support, along with other village groups, to have two reindeers on the Village Green. I understand from Miriam Harris that nearly 70 children had a great time meeting the reindeer and putting in Christmas requests to Father Christmas.

And finally ...

These notes have been anticipating some of what the Parish Council will be attempting to do on your behalf during the coming year. I am excited and optimistic that, with support from the village, the Parish Council can make a difference.

I hope that you are also able to anticipate 2024 with excitement and optimism.

1st December Walk - After parking on the Bedford Road in the village of Little Houghton we walked past the Church of St Mary the Virgin. We noticed that diagonally opposite at the crossroads was the old village stocks and whipping post. Following a quick survey of the walkers it was decided, somewhat surprisingly, that nobody had been caught of any misdemeanors that merited a session in the aforesaid weapon of punishment.

Turning left at the church we proceeded down Meadow Lane/Station Road, our approach being heralded by a magnificent Burmese Mountain Dog. At the edge of the village we turned left across a field, with magnificent views of the valley, across the lock turning left to walk along the river heading towards the Northampton Washlands. Walking around the lake, which was teeming with wetland birds, a couple of eagle eyed bird watchers estimated there were approaching one hundred swans on the lake. We walked around the lake before joining for a short distance the old Northampton - Wellingborough Railway Line. We turned left climbing the hill towards our cars in Little Houghton. At the top of the hill we turned to view the valley below, for some this was not the view they expected!

We retired to The White Hart in Great Houghton for a hearty lunch. Our grateful thanks to our beloved leader who yet again did a magnificent job in leading the walk from the rear.

Christmas Walk - After meeting at Northampton Golf Club, Harlestone, a group of 12 amblers walked across parkland passing Harlestone Institute (the building now used as a Village Hall) towards Upper Harlestone. Crossing a stream we turned back into parkland on a hard path to a road leading to the A238. Crossing this road we entered a field en route into the Firs, we zigzagged on several paths eventually emerging close to the Northampton to Rugby railway track. After crossing a very boggy area we emerged on to a hard field track which we followed back to the village.

It was interesting to find a water pump by the track close to a group of cottages, probably the only source of water in previous times. Re-crossing the A428 by the Fox and Hounds we followed a cul-de-sac to a path through undulating parkland, heading towards the Church, we came across a well, again probably the water supply for nearby houses. Re-crossing the stream, now fed by a waterfall at the head of the golf course lake, we followed the path alongside the churchyard heading back to the car park.

The whole group now swelled to 29 people for an excellent Christmas Lunch served in the Golf Club.

1st January Walk - A group of 11 walkers met at The Wharf Pub, Bugbrooke, for a 5 mile walk of canal and field. Leaving The Wharf we crossed the canal via the Litchborough Road Bridge and joined the tow path heading south. The frosty weather had left a thin coating of ice on the water but it had dried the muddy towpath making it easier for walking. passed a number of occupied boats with smoke curling from their chimneys and two pushing their way through the ice. continued to follow the canal for nearly 2 miles to Banbury Lane and en route in the fields saw a very life like bird, we guessed it was a buzzard before realizing it only flew in one small area and was a bird scare kite.



At Banbury Lane we stopped for our break by a milepost plaque dedicated to the leader's Grandfather who had lived in the canal house, built into the bridge, for 40 years working as Lengthsman on the stretch of canal from Braunston to Fenny Stratford.

Leaving the canal the group headed towards Rothersthorpe before crossing a small footbridge into the fields. Crossing 4 fields, surprisingly not too muddy, we came to Wards Lodge (farm buildings owned by the Adams' family) noticing, despite their age, how well preserved they are. From here we followed a hard track before again taking to the fields (now much wetter) towards Bugbrooke.

We crossed the Playing Fields noting the hard basketball or netball court and the smart new Rugby Club building as we entered the village at the end of Pilgrims Lane.

After walking down the lane we crossed Gayton Road entering a farmyard, then passed the smart new Cricket Pavilion. The group continued through tunnels under the canal and railway before emerging onto Cornhill where we turned back under the railway to the Wharf for lunch.

2nd January Walk - This walk followed parts of both the Nene Way and Midshires Way, from Kislingbury to Nether Heyford, then to Bugbrooke and back to Kislingbury. It was about 6 miles, across mostly flat grassed and ploughed fields, so was somewhat muddy at times.

The group of ten set off from The Red Lion, Kislingbury, in lovely sunshine. We walked across the fields and under the motorway to Bugbrooke Mill. A keen eyed member of the group spotted an owl flying around the trucks and machinery in the Mill grounds so we stopped to watch the beautiful snowy white bird.

The Nene Way then follows the river for a while before diverging to enter the edges of the village of Nether Heyford. Turning left as we entered the first housing estate in Nether Heyford, we walked back along the main road before picking up the Midshires Way which led us on to Bugbrooke. There were some lovely views across Bugbrooke and beyond as we reached the top of a small hill en route.

Entering the village, we passed a memorial plaque to Sue Pace, who some of the group remembered as a local nurse. We walked through the village towards Kislingbury until we reached a footpath next to the BT building. This is where the footpaths stop being signposted, and there were different views in the group about the way back. Fortunately our leader was closely following a map so we found our way back effortlessly.

We then had a delicious meal, good beer and excellent service from the staff at the Red Lion who are offering a very good value Walkers' Menu, which can be found on their Facebook page.
