Mrs Pauline Cook is no longer a member of the Parish Council and we as a Council would like to thank her for all of her hard work and dedication over a number of years. We are now looking for two new members to join the council. Please do not feel that you have to have been in the village for any length of time. If you feel passionate about our village and want to be part of decisions made, please speak to one of the councillors listed or contact our clerk, Mrs Ann Addison.

Due to the new houses built (Watts Close) the village were entitled to S106 monies. We have had half the money and now the other half has been given. This money is to be used for leisure facilities/activities and we would like to ask groups/clubs to apply for a part of this money. You need to have three quotes for the request and a date for when work, if necessary, is going to be started. Please forward your application to our clerk Mrs Ann Addison as soon as possible.

At a recent Committee Meeting it was reluctantly decided to increase the charges for advertising in the News. The new rates will operate from renewal dates commencing 1st June 2013. Neighbourhood Plan - Update

Having established the preferences of the Village given in the recent questionnaire, a meeting was held with South Northants Council to determine the next steps to be taken.

It was concluded that, subject to certain issues, it may be possible for a Neighbourhood Plan for Kislingbury to go forward relatively quickly. The Neighbourhood Planning Group with the support of the Parish Council will be focusing their efforts on this over the next few weeks and the Parish Council will apply to South Northants Council for the whole Parish to become a Neighbourhood Plan Area. Such a proposal has to wait six weeks to be cleared.

In addition, the Neighbourhood Plan Group agreed to identify the top concerns/initiatives indicated in the Village questionnaire (detailed in the April edition of the Kislingbury News) and share these with the Parish Council. This was agreed at the last Parish Council meeting and discussions and investigations will take place over the next few months.

We will keep you updated on a regular basis.



Mr Hedgehog for you to colour in.

Tales from Kislingbury Archives

The first anniversary edition of Kislingbury News, dated January, February and March 1955 reported that the village was to be without a bakehouse, after more than one hundred years. Mr. Marston was to retire after forty years on the High Street.

The following is an excerpt of the story of the bakehouse told by Mr. Sawbridge:

The bakehouse has suffered in the past from floods. The water which often rose to 6 to 8 inches, was kept out of the bakehouse by placing a board across the door and baulking it up with clay. I remember well one Sunday morning when the floods were over the road and a certain Mrs Lizzie Ward, when taking home her dinner*, accidentally let the joint fall from the stand into the water and in trying to retrieve it, dropped the pudding as well into the floods. On that same morning, a Mr. Ted Richardson, whom many of the villagers will remember, took home what he thought was his dinner only to be welcomed by his wife with ' Why, man, that ain't ourn, tek it back afore anybody 'as it.'

It was some distance across Gilberts Close and by the time Ted got back again through the floods, the dinners had all gone. There was nothing for it, thought Ted, but to take it back again and enjoy someone else's dinner, which he did.

*The bakehouse would open from twelve on a Sunday for delivery of dinners to be cooked in the oven.

In 2000 they started a group to support a clinic in Western Kenya and in 2006 that group became a registered charity and still supports that clinic at Butonge in Kenya as well as other projects in Tanzania.

Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter - May 2013

Lock snapping as a means of forced entry into homes is on the increase in some areas of the country, but it is a crime that can be easily beaten. NHW is working with Avocet Hardware that makes a lock that prevents Lock snapping. Michael Tuck, Managing Director of Avocet Hardware, said: "The rise in lock snapping is directly related to the increased use of uPVC and other double glazed doors, which are fitted as standard with a Euro cylinder lock that can be snapped and removed in a matter of seconds using nothing more than simple DIY tools." Hints and tips for securing your garden

- Installing strong fences or gates will act as a deterrent, preventing intruders getting easily into your garden.
- A Trellis fixed to the top of a fence is not only decorative but can provide extra protection as it is difficult to climb over, breaking easily and noisily.
- If there is an access point to your garden at the side of your house a strong lockable gate will act as a deterrent.
- Fit good quality locks to gates, and remember to always lock your gates.
- Planting prickly plants or a hedge, such as firethorn, climbing rose or hawthorn, around the perimeter of your garden can be a powerful deterrent.
- Gravel on paths and driveways can act as an alert to someone coming towards your property.
- Install dusk to dawn security lighting. The low energy lamp stays on in the dark and switches off when it starts to get light.
- Secure garden furniture and wheelie bins so they cannot be used to climb on and gain access to upstairs windows.
- Do not leave ladders lying around – they could be used by thieves to climb into an upstairs window. Keep them locked in a garage/shed.

If you live in **Ashby Close, Bugbrooke Road, or Watts Close (Sycamore Gardens)** please think about volunteering to become a Street Representative for your street. These streets have never had a Street Representative. Being a Street Representative is not hard work, but it does help to make your neighbourhood more secure. The streets without an active NHW presence are more vulnerable than the rest of the Village. 


