Notes from the meeting held on Tuesday 19th October

It was with great sorrow that we learned of the death of David Sanders. David was a Parish Councillor with many years service, including a term as Chairman, which he carried out with quiet efficiency and commitment. He was a well respected member of the village community and will be greatly missed. We offer our sincere condolences to Prim and her family.

Gill Clarke has, regrettably, decided to resign from the Parish Council, due to pressure of work. Gill has been a committed member of the team for some four years and has been our main link with the Village School. We would like to thank Gill for the support she has given to the Council and the village and hope that she will be back soon, when work commitments ease and she has more time.

With Gill's resignation, there is now a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you are interested in becoming a co-opted member of the Council, please contact our Parish Clerk, Ann Addison on 858226, or email a_addison@btinternet.com. If you would like to know a bit more about the Council, before you commit yourself, please do ask any of the Councillors. Air Pollution Northants Residents Alliance recently highlighted concerns about air pollution in Kislingbury. The Parish Council followed this up by writing to Steven Shuttleworth, Director of Service Delivery at South Northants Council, to request an Air Quality Survey in the village. In reply, Mr. Shuttleworth said that, so far as air quality in Kislingbury is concerned, Nitrogen Dioxide has been monitored for some years and continues to be monitored adjacent to the M1 and it is scheduled to continue to be monitored. The 'diffusion tubes' used for this work are changed on a monthly basis. So, in fact, SNC is already doing what the Parish Council requested. In terms of the impact of motorway traffic on air quality in Kislingbury, the key consideration is between M1 junctions 15a and 16. Millers Close is the only location between these junctions that is a relevant receptor. The motorway is relatively free flowing between these junctions, notwithstanding increases in traffic that Parish Councillors have commented on. The air quality is considered 'borderline' in terms of acceptability. Monitoring at these locations will therefore continue to check that the position does not get worse. If you would like to know a little more, Mr. Shuttleworth's letter can be found on the Parish Council website www.kislingburypc.org or on the Notice Board.

I hope you were disappointed that there was no Parish Council Report in last month's magazine!! As I said, the report is posted on the Parish Council Website under Village News, so why not log on and read it. To whet your appetite, there is an update on Allotment Land Transfer, Setting up an Email Database, Allotments and one or two other snippets. I also mentioned that our two village archivists, Lisa Dickson and Felicity Dunkley, would be attending the October meeting. You missed a treat!

Lisa and Felicity did attend the October meeting and demonstrated how they have organised the treasures that have become a part of the Village Archive. They would like more of your own treasures, in the form of photographs, maps, diaries, films, anecdotes etc. about life in Kislingbury, Past & Present. So look in your drawers and attics and see what you can find to augment the collection which is being preserved in our archives for future generations. The members of the Parish Council were very impressed by the way the artefacts have been organised, catalogued, cross-referenced and stored for the benefit of the Parish and would like to thank them both on your behalf for the hours of work they have put in to this very worthwhile project. Long may they continue.

Village Emergency Plans

Back in 1998 at Easter time 50 houses suffered serious flooding and at the time there was no village emergency plan in place to deal with such a situation.

It was after this event, having taken on the roll of Flood Warden, that I asked for volunteers to make up a team who could be called on at any time of day or night should we experience serious flooding again.

A team of volunteers was set up, but have never been called upon in times of need. The village hall committee also agreed and still will open up the hall should the need arise to provide refuge with food and drinks.

It is not only for flood disasters - our flood alleviation scheme built in 2003 has yet to be tested - but there may be other situations where an emergency team could be required. With the close proximity of the M1 there could be a very serious accident requiring help of some sort, a tornado could rip through the village, a major gas or electricity explosion or even a tanker explosion.

In 1998 the team were an able bodied unit, some have left the village and dare I say, the remainder are 12 years older!!

The Parish Council are in the process of revamping the village emergency plans and are asking if there are any folk, able bodied, who are prepared to put their name forward in case of need.


This is a copy of the letter which the school received from Dr Neil Hawkes following his values audit visit

Neighbourhood Watch Newsletter - November 2010

Village news - Not too much to report in the Village, but there was one distressing incident. In Nene Way a Distraction Theft happened during which the victim lost their Credit Card whilst being distracted by people who approached them whilst they were unloading their car. In Mill Lane rowdy youths broke a window in a house there one night with a stone thrown from the street. Not only is this very distressing for the people living there, it is very dangerous. We all need to play our part in making it clear to young people that this kind of behaviour is unacceptable in our Village.

Local news - Nothing of note to report concerning our neighbouring villages. However, you might like to know that Jen Harrison, our Police Community Support Officer, has received an Award for her work with our Village and the rest of the Community that she supports. Well done Jen!!

Following up from last Month's Newsletter, I can tell you that the Fire Service has received very few requests for FREE checks of homes for Fire Safety. Following these checks they have FREE Fire Alarms to give to residents if they feel the house needs it. Please do not let this opportunity go if you have any doubts about the safety of your family in the event of a Fire. Please contact me or your Street Representative if you want to have a Safety Check Visit.

SmartWater is a very powerful deterrent against theft, and ensures that stolen goods, when recovered, are returned to the owner. You may already use **SmartWater**, but if you do not and would like to know more, please contact your Street Representative. Please place your order with your Street Representative. Buying through the NHW will save you a lot of money. I am about to place an order for SmartWater. The next one will be a long time in the future, probably. Please contact me or your Street representative if you want to place an order. I have a UV Light which I am happy to demonstrate to show you how UV Light works, and also to check items that you have marked, or to check if your SmartWater is still effective (after 2 years it can lose its fluorescence as a liquid in the tube. Marked items will be fine). The order will be placed 5 days after the Newsletter is delivered.

I am happy to say that we have some new volunteers to help us with our Scheme. Lal Clayson (Tel: 839017) will look after Church Lane with Hilary Nevison Andrews, and Malcolm Thompson (07931311606) will help Dee Taylor with Nene Way. Thanks to these new members to our team. We still need more Volunteers for Streets not yet covered. Please see the Village Web site for the full list of Street Representatives at <http://www.kislingburyonline.co.uk>. This web site is for the Village and contains many interesting pages on other subjects.

NEW PROJECT - VILLAGE EMAIL DATABASE

We have learned how successful Gayton Village has been with a project to create a Village Wide Database of email addresses. This database is used to broadcast Neighbourhood Watch messages, as well as messages of interest to the Community, such as Road Closure news. With the support of the Parish Council a small team of Villagers is planning how to do the same in Kislingbury. It is very likely that in the next month you will be receiving a visit from someone living in the Village who will outline to you what are the benefits of the database, and ask for your support by contributing your address. We hope that we can get a very large number of people to participate. If anyone would like to help with this project please contact me by email.
