

Kislingbury Parish Council

These notes highlight some of the many issues that the Parish Council is involved with because of its responsibilities as the most local tier of English local government. They supplement the publicly available minutes which are available online (on the Parish Council website) and on the notice boards around the village. I would like to thank our public spirited handyman for the repairs to the damaged notice board on Bugbrooke Road.

The Parish Council meets at the Village Hall at 7:30 p.m. on the third Tuesday of every month apart from August. Since the last set of Parish Council Notes (August/September 2022) there was a Parish Council meeting on 20th September 2022. Parish Council meetings are, legally, the only context in which the Parish Council can make decisions. This is particularly important when it comes to spending the public money that the Council is responsible for.

Kislingbury residents are always most welcome to attend any Parish Council meeting and have an opportunity to raise any issues as part of the Parishioner's Voice agenda item. Parishioner's Voice is a very direct way of raising issues and concerns with your Parish Council. This item is always early on the agenda. While you do not have to stay for the whole meeting, I would encourage you to stay on to observe at least some of the meeting to see the range of issues that come to the Parish Council.

In the May Parish Council notes, which appeared in the Kislingbury News of June/July 2022, I expressed the Parish Council's appreciation of the very strong response from the village in respect of the proposal to build 58 houses on land off Camp Lane and Beech Lane. In these notes. At the time of writing, the Parish Council has not heard of any planning decision from West Northants Council about this proposal.

Parking is a problem in many areas of the village, including Mill Road. Our Parish Clerk has received a reply from WNC Highways about restricted parking for residents. The full detail of this reply will be in the Parish Council Minutes on the 20 September meeting. However, if you have a Blue Badge, it is possible to apply for a 'disabled line and sign' which would enable you to park close to your property. There is information on the WNC website and you can apply for a disabled space at westnorthants.gov.uk.

I mentioned in the last set of Parish Council notes that the Parish Council will be setting its budget again in November. This sets out how the Parish Council intends to spend *your* money - the money that is raised via Council Tax. It is inevitable, and necessary for this to be increased but the Parish Council welcomes any comments and suggestions

about our intention to increase the Parish Council precept. The Parish Council is very conscious of the responsibility it has to spend public money carefully and with accountability. At the November meeting we will be agreeing grants to local organisations on the basis of application forms that are available from our Parish Clerk. The forms will ask applicants to say how the grant will be spent and agree to provide evidence about how the grant was spent.

Kislingbury is a village that contains wide disparities of wealth and income. The recent increases in energy and food prices means that more people than ever struggle to make ends meet or have to decide whether to heat or eat. For this reason, the Parish Council has decided to open, 'The Kislingbury Larder' in October. The scheme will be open to all Kislingbury residents in need, and will ensure that those joining the scheme will have a grocery box once a week. All requests for help will be treated confidentially and comply with data protection regulations. If you wish to apply, please contact the Parish Clerk by phone (01604 858226) or email (parishclerk811@btinternet.com).

The Parish Council would also welcome any approaches from village organisations that have ideas that might help with the 'cost of living crisis', for example by offering a 'community living room'. Again please contact our Parish Clerk to discuss your suggestion.

At the September 2022 meeting, the Parish Council agreed to replace a faulty light in Millers Close. This is just one example of the range of village maintenance coordinated by the council. This year we have had a mowing contract for the Village Greens and verges. I think generally this has worked well and despite incidents of unhelpful parking and the very dry weather, the Greens do look well cared for. It was also good to see the Old Pond Site (on the Bugbrooke Road) looking much tidier having been cleared ready for wildflower planting.

The Parish Council is still looking for two more Parish Councillors. If you think you might be interested but want to know a little more before committing yourself please get in touch with the Parish Clerk to find out what is involved. The same applies for vacancies for Flood and Tree Wardens.

Having sent Evelyn Banner a 100th Birthday Card recently, the Parish Council was delighted to be asked to do the same again for Rene Hall. If you know that someone is approaching their 100th birthday, and who would like a card, please do contact our Parish Clerk.

FLOOD WARDEN

After 24 years as your flood warden, and well into the octogenarian age group, I have decided that it is time that I should retire, as clambering up river banks and over fences is not as easy as it used to be! It was my intention to do so at Xmas 2020 but due to the floods we had then in The High Street, Hodges Lane and in Beech Lane I did not think it was fair to lumber a new person with the problems that we obviously had, especially as it took nearly a week for the water to disappear from Beech Lane.

Back in the Autumn of 1998 my dear wife, Delphine, came home from a KPC meeting and asked if I would like to be the Kislingbury Flood Warden.

"What does it involve?" I asked.

"I don't know," came the reply.

I gave it some thought and decided to take the challenge on board. It certainly has been a learning curve but I could not have done it, hopefully to my best and your satisfaction, without the support of the staff in the Environment Agency and the Council Highways Dept. Also the cooperation of yourselves has been greatly appreciated by me. As I have written over recent months we found many issues with the drainage systems in the village and most of 2021 was spent rectifying them. At this moment of time the rectification work has not yet been tested in anger. However, I am reasonably confident that it will be successful.

If there is anyone out there who wishes to volunteer for the position then you should contact the Parish Council. I am happy to support the person who takes this position on to settle in. KPC contact details are in the front of Kislingbury News. Please bear in mind you could receive calls in the middle of the night or be walking the village at some unearthly hour of the night.



Kislingbury Amblers



We are a group of like minded individuals who meet usually on the first and third Wednesday of each month to have a walk of about 5 miles in the local area and then a pub lunch.

August - 1st walk. This walk started from The Obelisk, Northampton. The Obelisk is a 100 feet high monument built in 1764 by Lord Stafford, owner of what was then the extensive Boughton Estate.

Leaving the Obelisk, 10 amblers walked through a wooded area on to the picturesque village of Boughton from where we walked downhill to a stream leading towards Pitsford. Much to our surprise, despite the recent dry weather, there was quite an extensive boggy area near the stream which we had to skirt.

Crossing several fields we joined the road into Pitsford. Turning right onto a footpath we headed across fields towards Moulton, crossing a road we entered Spectacle Lane where we encountered a ford which some amblers chose to paddle across.

Towards the end of Spectacle Lane we stopped to view a large area bounded by two turrets (a folly we believe). Arriving at Moulton we stopped to view a very ornate gate made from horticultural/agriculture tools which led to a property built on similar lines to the folly seen previously.

We now turned back towards Boughton village stopping on route to view the derelict Church of St John dating back to 1201. The graveyard is still used for burials today. On arrival back in Boughton village we took the footpath through a field and wooded area back to the Obelisk. This was an interesting, varied and scenic walk on the edge of Northampton.

August - 2nd walk. The Amblers made a return visit to Sywell Reservoir for this walk. Weather-wise, luck was on our side, as showers were promised but never materialised.

The party of five set off and it wasn't long before one of the eagle-eyed Amblers noticed froglets crossing our footpath heading for the water.

Well into our walk, another of our group dropped back to spend some time familiarising himself with the antics of the black pigs which were sleeping peacefully in an enclosure.

Moving on and avoiding the froglets, we completed the walk and decided to have lunch at the Horseshoe Inn in Sywell.

Our first September walk commenced at the village hall in Byfield. Crossing the main road and walking behind the Cross Tree Pub, we headed to the western edge of the village where, on the way, a house was spotted which once was the Bell Inn.

Exiting the village, we took the bridleway towards the village of Aston Le Walls which, at one time, was the bridleway to Byfield Railway sidings. Leaving fields and heading along a road to a T junction, we passed an equestrian centre and once at the junction we took a short break.

Refreshed, we took a steep climb towards Little Boddington and subsequently left the tarmac and crossed fields back to where we started.

During this latter part of the walk, one of our ladies spotted a plaque in memory of Sandy Denny who had lived in Byfield and who played her last gig there. Lunch was taken at the Narrowboat Inn at Weedon.
