Kislingbury Parish Council September 2023

These notes reflect the Parish Council's July and September meetings. We have a break from formalised meetings in August, however work doesn't stop for the Summer break, we have been busy catching up with outstanding work and paperwork needed to keep the village running as smoothly as possible.

Planning Applications

We have 3 planning applications which cause us the most concern:

- 1. The Spitfire development. We are concerned there is no discernible plan with the road changes; there appears to be a road calming/narrowing of the road outside of the Spitfire entry and we are concerned regarding the impact this will have on the planning for the pavement area opposite the development. These plans have not yet been shared and we have contacted National Highways regarding their input into this as well as the planning office at West Northants.
 - There is also a rather large entry to the next field after the Spitfire development, and while there is no planning for additional housing, the Spitfire office on their development identifies a further 2 fields of Spitfire Homes. The West Northants planning team assure us there has been no pre planning or planning application for additional houses. We are further concerned with water run off from this development and the impact it has had on drainage in the bridleway ditches in Camp Lane. We are currently in contact with the various authorities regarding all of these.
- 2. Beech Lane development. We are pleased to say that 2 similar developments in Roade and Hanslope have been rejected by the planners, one at appeal. Since our last update we have had a very strong supportive objection from the British Horse Society. Please remember that this application has been "called in" by WNC Councillor Adam Brown and means that the WNC planning committee will make its final decision after considering the planning officer's recommendation and hearing from village representation, the Chairman, another parish councillor and a parishioner. We are yet to hear further but will keep you informed regarding the progress of this planning application.
- 3. **Hodges Lane development.** There are significant concerns regarding this development. We are writing to the West Northamptonshire planning department asking them to confirm to us why the following actions have taken place on the site without any follow up from the planners:

- a. Trees have been removed from a conservation area prior to agreement from the planners. This leaves the site at more risk of flooding, the significant number of trees that were on the site are no longer there to keep flooding to a minimum.
- b. We believe the site may have had soil dumped on it to make the ground higher, and we are asking the planners to investigate whether this has happened or not.
- c. We are also concerned that there has been no evidence of the Knotweed having been removed from the site and we are asking for evidence that this has been removed by a specialist firm.

Road Closures

As soon as we have confirmation regarding road closures within the village they are posted on the Kislingbury Facebook page, this will be from the Vice Chair's Facebook page as Janet Anderson. Unfortunately the PC does not receive advanced information regarding all of the road works that take place. Thank you to those villagers who let the rest of the village know via social media.

Precept 2024/2025

Our Precept is the amount of income we have to run all the services we have in the village. It's coming up to that time of the year when we set our Precept for the village. We like to support a number of organisations but we need to know your needs so we can add to the Precept. If you are one of the village organisations and would like support from the Parish Council, please contact Ann Addison and she will send the appropriate form to complete and return to her, or indeed attend the PC meetings in either October or November and speak to us directly so we have a better context of your needs and can add to the Precept. For example, we are looking at carrying out a tree survey of the trees that belong to the village and this will be a new item on our Precept.

CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy).

Thank you to those of you who have suggested ways in which this can be spent to the benefit of as many villagers as possible. If you would still like to suggest ways in which we might spend our CIL money please do email our Parish Clerk directly with your suggestions. Members of the PC will meet sometime during October/November to confirm the rest of the spend and we are keen to make health and safety a priority within the village.

The PC is in the process of ordering/replacing:

- 3 VAS signs (with smiley faces which are colour coded red amber and green) to alert drivers to the speed limits around our village.
- 3 of our notice boards,
- various rusty bins,
- concrete lamp posts,
- new flower planters at the various entrances to the village,
- an interpretation panel/village map of important points in the village.

We have also added twice monthly grass cuts on the small greens outside The Cromwell to enhance the entry to the village. WNC Highways is visiting the village with our Parish Clerk later this month to look at whether reducing the speed limit to 20 around the school is possible and whether the bridge limit can be reduced to 7.5 tonnes.

We are pleased to welcome Richard as our newest councillor, he is taking on the portfolio of the village website, and look forward to his expertise in the development of the website.

There is still one vacancy for a councillor so if you are interested in taking on this role, please do contact Ann Addison, our Parish Clerk, with a brief overview of the knowledge and skills you have that would contribute to the PC.

We are a group of like minded individuals who meet usually on the first and third Wednesday of each month to have a walk of about 5 miles in the local area and then a pub lunch.

First Walk of August - We left the village of Tiffield, over the SMJ railway track and headed across fields towards and along the Gayton Road. After a short distance we turned right along a bridle way towards the Eastcote Road passing magic mushrooms which seemed to have a funny effect on one or two of our walkers. The timing, by our leader, of this section of the walk was superb, as whilst on the bridle path we were sheltered by the surrounding trees from the worst of a tremendous down pour. On emerging from the bridle path we saw by the colour of the distant clouds how lucky we had been in avoiding a thorough drenching.

On reaching the Eastcote Road we headed towards Gayton, turned right between two ponds, which were very nearly dry, and crossed the Tiffield Road and through the old redundant ironstone workings. On reaching the Blisworth Road by the garage we turned right then right again past the cottages and headed towards Gayton Wilds.

At the bridge over the SMJ dismantled railway we descended some very dodgy steps onto the track bed, heading back to Tiffield, into our cars and away for lunch. Our leader lead the walk from the back, signalling directions with his walking stick, those on the front signalling in return when the message was understood.

Second Walk of August - Leaving our cars at the Plume of Feathers in Weedon Bec we headed across Jubilee Fields, picking up two further walkers on the way. Walking under the West Coast Main Line Railway and Grand Union Canal we climbed up the steep steps to join the tow path and then headed south.

After a short distance we left the tow path, going over the railway and headed across the fields towards Church Stowe spying in the distance the church of St Michael with its yellow tower which looked completely out of place. On speaking with a local dog walker, we were informed that the old rendering on the tower had become unstable and had been replaced. Further information can be found at St. Michael's Renovations (stoweninechurches.org.uk).

We continued through the village and down towards the A5, on the way receiving a wave from one of our walker's HWMBO, her sister and brother in law. After crossing the A5

we walked alongside the embankment of the disused railway which used to transport limestone and iron ore down to the canal and later to the main railway line.

We joined the canal tow path and headed back towards Weedon, leaving the tow path adjacent to the Church of St Peter and St Paul and onwards to the Plume of Feathers for lunch.

September Walk - After ordering lunch we left the Red Lion in East Haddon and headed towards Holdenby. After a few hundred yards we turned left and walked across several fields until we reached the road, passing Holdenby Lodge House and proceeded into the charming village of Holdenby. This section of the walk included grassland, farm tracks with a few stiles thrown in for good measure.

After a short break in the village we continued in the general direction of Althorp for two miles along a bridleway. Of interest in this part of the walk was a circular mound which was part of the old garden belonging to Holdenby House. Turning right, the remainder of the walk was on farm tracks and after a short distance we climbed a very steep hill passing the now derelict Rowell Leyes Farm at the top.

We headed back to East Haddon via the cricket ground for lunch. This walk commenced and ended in heavy rain, with a dry period in the middle with strong winds throughout. Nevertheless we still enjoyed the spectacular views.

Our leader enjoyed the walk at home before joining us for lunch!

- They will give you the key code
- Go to The Sun
- Enter key code and open case
- Take defibrillator back to the patient in cardiac arrest
- Open defibrillator
- Follow voice instructions from defibrillator and administer as advised
- Administer CPR as advised by 999 operative
- Return defibrillator to The Sun and place in the cabinet

We now also have an **Emergency Bleed Control Kit** located outside the shop.

To use it call 999 and listen to the instructions.
